INTERNATIONAL DEFINITION

"Trafficking in persons" shall mean the recruitment, transportation, transfer, harboring or receipt of persons, by means of the threat or use of FORCE or other forms of COERCION, of abduction, of FRAUD, of deception, of the abuse of power or of a position of vulnerability or of the giving or receiving of payments or benefits to achieve the consent of a person having control over another person, for the purpose of exploitation.

According to the Palermo Protocol at the United Nations – 2000

This protocol contains the first internationally agreed upon definition of human trafficking



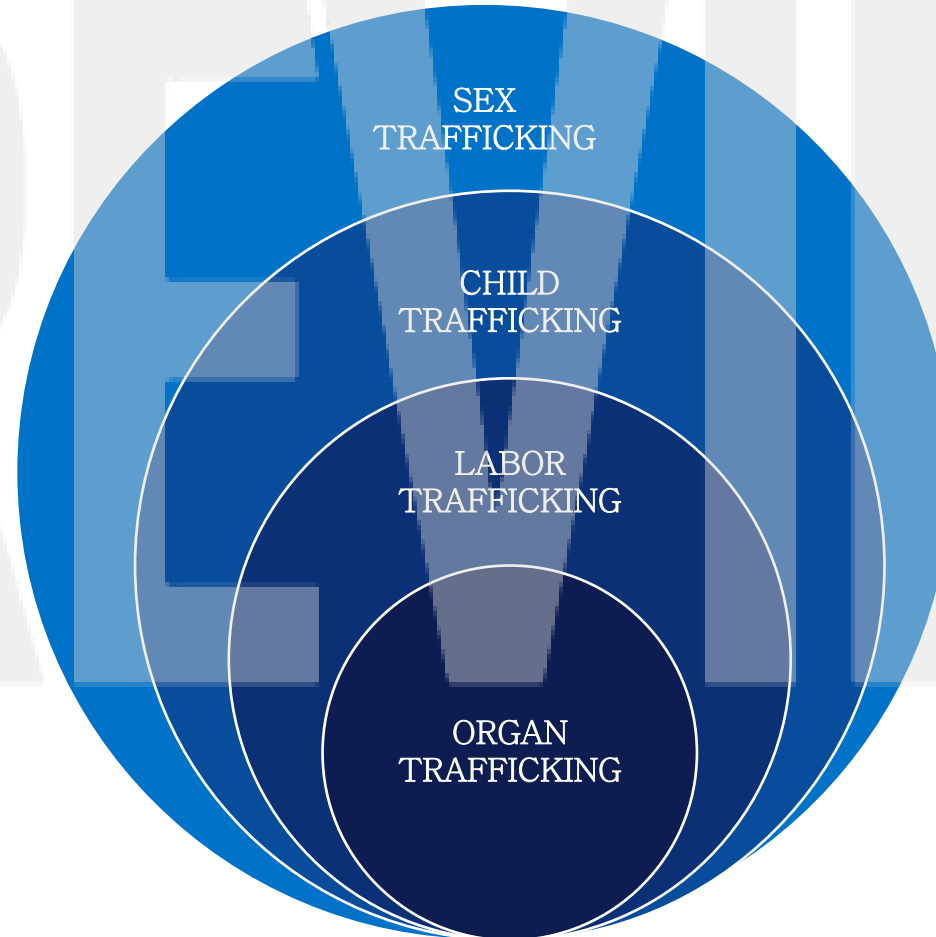

FORMS OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING

LABOR TRAFFICKING

Labor Trafficking is a form of trafficking in which individuals perform labor or services through the use of force, fraud, or coercion. Labor trafficking includes situations of debt bondage, forced labor, and involuntary child labor.



Sex Trafficking is human trafficking for the purpose of sexual exploitation, including sexual slavery. A victim is forced, in one of a variety of ways, into a situation of dependency on their trafficker(s) and then used by said trafficker(s) to give sexual services to customers.

FORMS OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING

CHILD TRAFFICKING

Child Trafficking is the "recruitment, transportation, transfer, harboring, and/or receipt" kidnapping of a child for the purpose of slavery, forced labor and exploitation. Children may also be trafficked for the purpose of adoption.



Organ Trafficking is the recruitment, transport, transfer, harboring of a person for the receipt of their human organs by means of the threat, or use of force, or other forms of coercion, of abduction, of fraud, of deception, of the abuse of power or of a position of vulnerability.

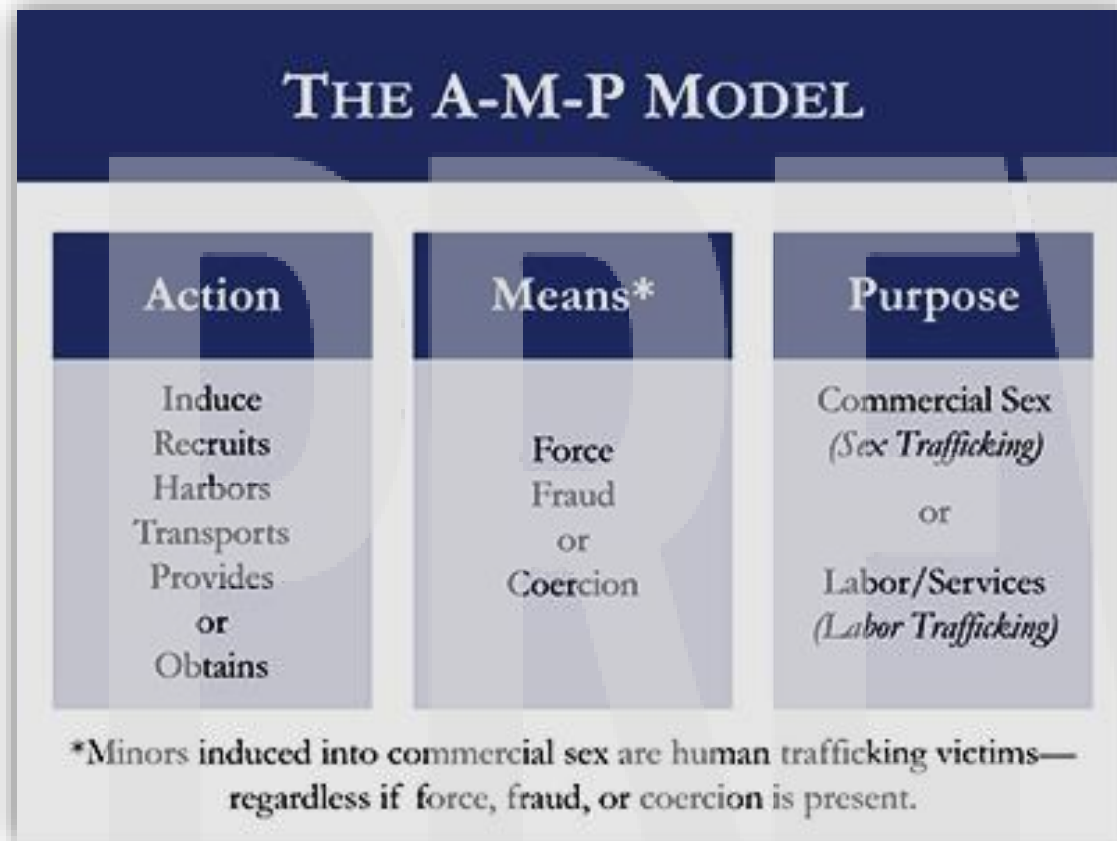

A-M-P MODEL



Force

Can involve physical restraint and physical harm

Fraud

Involves false promises regarding employment, wages, working conditions

Coercion

Can involve the grooming process leading to threats against : **THE VICTIM AND/OR THEIR LOVED ONES**





FORCE, FRAUD, AND COERCION

EXCEPTION

CHILDREN UNDER AGE 18 INDUCED INTO COMMERCIAL SEX DO NOT NEED TO PROVE FORCE, FRAUD OR COERCION.

Sex traffickers **LURE** minors because they are easier to manipulate.

Each state has different requirements for reporting child trafficking to child protective services, be familiar with your state law and your hospitals policies and procedures.
